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Call for applications for the 2nd level Specializing Master's Programme in "Space Exploration and Development Systems" (19th edition), Academic Year 2026/2027

ART. 1

(Programme overview)

The 19th edition of the 2nd level Specializing Master's Programme in "Space Exploration and Development Systems" (SEEDS) is offered by Politecnico di Torino for the academic year 2026/2027.

The administrative office for this Specializing Master's Programme is at Politecnico di Torino – Specializing Master's Programmes and Lifelong Learning Office ("Ufficio Master e Formazione Permanente").

The Programme is managed by the "Specializing Master's Programmes and Lifelong Learning School" ("Scuola di Master e Formazione Permanente").

The Programme Director is Nicole Viola, professor at the Department of Management and Production Engineering of Politecnico di Torino.

ART. 2

(Training objective, didactic contents and organization of the activities)

SEEDS is focused on the human and robotic exploration of space and on the related missions, systems, and technologies. The purpose of the Programme is to provide young graduates with the core applied physics and engineering skills required to develop space systems and missions from initial concept through design, assembly and verification, to launch and operations.

The 2nd level Specializing Master is a one-year full-time programme worth a total of 80 ECTS.

The Project Work is organized as an internship and is divided in three phases (see table n. 1), each one performed in a different SEEDS site. During the first and second internship phases, students may be hosted by a European national space agency for sessions of concurrent design. The final event of the SEEDS Programme will be held at ESA/Estec or at a European national space agency, where students will present the main outcomes of their Project Work.

The Project Work deals with the design of a wide human space exploration mission. A different mission is identified every year in cooperation with the three SEEDS sites and in agreement with the main supporting industries.

Lectures will be held in English; training activities, except for site visits and internship, will take place at Campus Politecnico – Lingotto.



The Specializing Master's programme is residential but in case of students who, following the selection process, are admitted to the programme and cannot, for justified and documented reasons, attend the programme in person, the Scientific Committee could consider at its sole discretion their request and allow them to attend the programme online.

Please note that:

- this possibility might be available only as far as lectures are concerned, the internship requires mandatory in-person attendance
- students attending the programme online are not eligible for scholarships. They will be either required to attend the programme in person or renounce the scholarship (see Art. 9).

The teaching Programme includes 5 months classroom activities with academic and corporate teaching staff and it is structured as follows (see table n. 2):

- 7 courses
- Internship

ART. 3 **(Admission requirements)**

The 2nd level Specializing Master's Programme is open to a maximum of 20 participants.

Admission requirements are:

- Full degree (Master of Science degree/Laurea specialistica/Laurea magistrale or equivalent qualification) in the following areas:
 - LM 17 – Physics
 - LM 18 – Computer Science
 - LM 20 – Aerospace and Astronautic Engineering
 - LM 22 – Chemical Engineering
 - LM 25 – Automation Engineering
 - LM 27 – Telecommunications Engineering
 - LM 28 – Electrical Engineering
 - LM 29 – Electronic Engineering
 - LM 30 – Energy and Nuclear Engineering
 - LM 31 – Management Engineering
 - LM 32 – Computer Systems Engineering
 - LM 33 – Mechanical Engineering

- LM 44 – Mathematical Modelling for Engineering
- LM 53 – Materials engineering
- LM 58 – Universe Sciences

For applicants with a non-Italian qualification: 5 years or more (10 semesters) university career, in the above-mentioned disciplines.

If you don't have your Master's degree yet but you are going to graduate before the enrolment deadline, you can still submit your application. However, please note that if you do not obtain the degree within the enrollment deadline you will not be admitted to the programme.

The Selection Committee has the right, at its discretion, to assess the admission of candidates graduated in scientific and technical disciplines other than those indicated, if they are deemed to have the necessary scientific and cultural background to attend the lessons.

- A good knowledge of the English language is required (equivalent to CEFR level B2) and must be certified by a language certificate (See Table n. 3 – English Language certificates).

In alternative to one of the above-listed certificates you can provide, within the deadline for applications, a stamped declaration/certificate on headed paper, certifying that:

- You have attended at least one semester at high school in an English-speaking country or one semester at a high school/University in which the medium of instruction is English. In this last case the school/University must issue a certificate stating that: "The medium of instruction is English";
- You have a foreign high school diploma recognized by the Italian Ministry of Education and Research as equivalent to the Italian high school diploma (diploma di maturità), or you have a higher qualification awarded by a higher education institution in an English-speaking country or in which the medium of instruction is English. In both cases the school/University must issue a certificate stating that "The medium of instruction is English".

With regard to points "a" and "b", please note that diplomas awarded by high schools or higher institutions in the USA, UK, Canada, Ireland, Australia and New Zealand do not need to include the phrase "The medium of instruction is English".

If the applicant does not have one of the required English language certificates, the Selection Committee will assess the level of knowledge of the English language through a remote interview (in accordance with Art. 4 of this Call for application).



ART. 4

(Admission and Selection process)

Admission and deadline

You can apply for admission for this Master's programme ONLY through the Apply@polito procedure and you can download the Application Form available at: <https://www.polito.it/en/education/specializing-master-s-programmes-and-lifelong-learning/specializing-master-s-programmes/specializing-master-s-catalogue/space-exploration-and-development-systems/admission/documentation-required>

Applications sent by e-mail, fax or mail will NOT be considered.

Application deadline: **October 16th 2026 at 2:00 pm – Italian time**

Step 1. Evaluation of applicants' qualifications

ALL the following documents must be attached to your application on Politecnico di Torino website (in English or Italian only):

1. Valid identification document (passport for non-EU applicants)
2. Curriculum vitae
3. List of exams of both Bachelor's and Master's degree programmes:
 - for applicants with degree(s) obtained from a non-Italian University or a private Italian University: official transcript(s), issued by the University of origin, on headed paper, containing the full list of all the exams passed and the grades obtained. The transcript(s) must also include the date of degree conferral. Upon enrolment, the admitted candidates must submit the original copy of the "Dichiarazione di Valore"/"Statement of Validity" (related to the Master's degree) issued by the Italian diplomatic authorities in the country where the qualification was awarded. If the Master's degree was awarded by a European university, admitted candidates can attach the "Diploma Supplement" instead of the "Dichiarazione di Valore".

or

- for applicants with degree(s) obtained from an Italian Public University: self-certification ("dichiarazione sostitutiva di certificazione" – Art. 46 DPR 28 December 2000, n. 445) in which applicants declare to have obtained both a Bachelor and a Master's degree.

The self-declaration must include: name of degree, name of the University, date of degree conferral and graduation final grade, full list of all the exams passed and grades obtained (this information is required for both degrees).



In compliance with art. 75 of D.P.R. 445/2000, should the self-certification be found to be false or incorrect, applicants lose any benefit they might have acquired on the basis of the untruthful declaration.

5. Motivation Letter: max 1 page (please, see template available at the following link: <https://www.polito.it/en/education/specializing-master-s-programmes-and-lifelong-learning/specializing-master-s-programmes/specializing-master-s-catalogue/space-exploration-and-development-systems/admission/documentation-required>)

If you fail to attach even one of the above mandatory documents, you will be excluded from the selection process.

Optional documents can be attached to the application:

- Thesis' abstract: this document is one of the elements attesting the coherence with the Master's topics;
- English language certificate; candidates who do not submit a certificate and are eligible for the second step of the selection process (see below) will be interviewed to assess their knowledge of the English language.

After the application deadline, the Selection Committee assesses all the applications and the attached documents.

The Selection Committee can assign a maximum of **90** points, according to the following criteria:

- maximum 40 points related to the CV: studies, publications, awards (max 35 points); work experiences and coherence with Specializing Master's topic (maximum 5 points);
 - maximum 30 points for education results: average grade; number of years to obtain the final degree;
 - maximum 10 points for the motivation: motivation letter analysis (max 5 points) and number of years passed between the date of the MSc degree and the application to SEEDS programme (max 5 points);
 - English language proficiency (up to 10 points), according to the criteria set out in Art.3
- If none of the options applies, no points will be assigned to the candidate for the English language level.

The final score will be based on the above-mentioned criteria, up to a maximum of **90 points**. Candidates who do not reach the minimum score of **40 points** will be considered as "ineligible" and they will not be admitted to the second step of the selection process.



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Step 2. Remote Interview

In this phase, the Selection Committee interviews the applicants who passed the first step of the selection process.

Interviews aim to assess:

- the applicants' motivation;
- any previous experience which may be relevant to the contents of the Specializing Master's programme.

Interviews will take place remotely soon after the deadline for application submission. Applicants are required to show an identification document before the interview in order to prove their identity.

Please note that applicants who do not attend the interview are automatically excluded from the selection process.

The Selection Committee can assign a maximum of **10 points** for the remote interview. The overall score is the sum of the score obtained in the first and second steps of the selection process.

The person responsible for the admission administrative procedure is Mr. Alberto Pusceddu (Head of the Unit of Specializing Master's Programmes and Lifelong Learning at Politecnico di Torino).

ART. 5 (Selection outcomes)

At the end of the selection process, a merit-ranking list will be published on the online University Bulletin and on the Selection Outcomes page of the Specializing Master's Programme's website <https://www.polito.it/en/education/specializing-master-s-programmes-and-lifelong-learning/specializing-master-s-programmes/specializing-master-s-catalogue/space-exploration-and-development-systems>

The ranking list will contain:

- the list of applicants admitted to the Specializing Master's Programme;
- the list of applicants on the reserve list.

ART. 6 (Participation confirmation, enrolment and documents submission)

Participation confirmation



If you are admitted to the Specializing Master's Programme, in order to confirm your participation, you must, within a given deadline:

- download the Acceptance Declaration, fill it in and send it by e-mail to master.universitari@polito.it;
- pay a 1.000,00 € advance fee (see ART. 8). You will receive the advance fee payment request on the same day of the publication of the selection outcomes. You will be given a week to proceed with payment.

Failure to send the declaration and payment within the deadline is considered as final renunciation to the programme.

If you are on the reserve list, you are eligible for replacement and will have the possibility to enrol in the programme if one or more participants renounce their offer of admission. In this case, the Specializing Master's Programmes and Lifelong Learning Office will contact you according to your order on the ranking list.

If you decide to decline your offer of admission, you are invited to inform the Specializing Master's Programmes and Lifelong Learning Office (master.universitari@polito.it) with an official notification.

Enrolment

If you are admitted, you must enrol at Politecnico before the programme starts. You will receive an e-mail with necessary information for your enrolment.

Documents submission

If your degree was awarded by a non-Italian University, upon enrolment you must submit the original copy of the *Dichiarazione di Valore*/Statement of Validity (related to your degree) issued by the Italian Diplomatic Mission in the country where the qualification was awarded or *Attestato di Comparabilità* /Statement of Comparability issued by the CIMEA Centre.

If your degree was awarded by a European University, you can submit your Diploma Supplement instead of the *Dichiarazione di Valore*/Statement of Validity.

If you do not submit your Statement of Validity, you can enrol in the programme under condition, but you must present this document within 6 months from the beginning of the programme. If you do not provide the above-mentioned mandatory document by the deadline, you are placed on hold and cannot progress in your studies until you actually present this document.



If you are a non-EU student, you are required to comply with the norms on entry visa¹ and residence permit. You have to submit:

- Student Visa – type D for participants who are non-EU citizens residing abroad;
- Valid residence permit for non-EU citizens residing in Italy.

Politecnico di Torino reserves the right to check the truthfulness of the declarations included in self-certificates sent by the applicants (pursuant to Article 46 of DPR. no. 445 of 28 December 2000) and to exclude them from the ranking list in the event of false declarations.

ART. 7

(Student assessment and final qualification)

The Specializing Master's Programme requires your full-time commitment. You are requested to attend activities for at least 90% of the programme.

Absences for more than 10% of total classroom hours will lead to exclusion from the Specializing Master's Programme.

In case of withdrawal, you should send a written communication to the Specializing Master's Programmes and Lifelong Learning Office.

In order to obtain the Specializing Master's degree, the Master Director will also evaluate the student's participation in the activities and their compliance with the Programme regulations.

Detailed rules about the exams will be provided on the opening day.

Student assessment

At the end of each course, you will have an evaluation that may consist of either a written or oral test, a work group, a paper presentation or a mix of all of them. If you fail the exam a make-up exam can be arranged directly with the professor responsible for the course. A make-up exam can be taken only once.

At the end of the programme, you will make a final presentation (dissertation of your project work conducted during internship) and are assessed for it.

The final grade is assigned by the Graduation Examining Committee who will assess the overall average grade of all the exams on a scale of 110. The Graduation Examining Committee can add a maximum of 5 points, taking into consideration the evaluation of your project work (dedication, autonomy, methodological rigour, relevance of results, etc.).

If you reach the score of 110/110, the Graduation Examining Committee might decide to confer the degree with honours (cum laude). The decision must be taken by qualified majority (at least 2/3 of the Graduation Examining Committee members).

More details about the exams, final presentation and project work will be presented at the beginning of the programme.

Final qualification

Upon completion of the programme, participants who regularly attended the activities and earned 80 ECTS (required for graduation), are awarded the “Space Exploration and Development Systems” 2nd level Specializing Master’s diploma by Politecnico di Torino. The diploma will be issued in English.

If, at the end of the Specializing Master’s Programme, you have not passed all the exams included in your Study Plan you can get a Certificate of Attendance and a Transcript of Records with the list of the exams you have passed with grades, dates, credits and scientific disciplinary field.

ART. 8

(Participation and enrolment fee)

Participation and enrolment fee

The participation fee is 3.600,00 € (three thousand six hundred/00) + 21,00 € (twenty-one/00)² for the enrolment fee (Premium for accident insurance 5,00 € + Enrolment revenue stamp 16,00 €).

The total amount shall be paid to Politecnico di Torino according to the following instalments:

- 1.000,00 € (one thousand/00) advance fee by the date defined by Politecnico as the deadline for accepting the offer of admission to the Specializing Master's programme. You will receive the advance fee payment request on the same day of the publication of the selection outcomes. You will be given a week to proceed with payment. This payment is mandatory to confirm your participation in the Specializing Master’s programme. Failure to send payment within the aforementioned term is considered as final renunciation to the programme;
- 2.600,00 (two thousand six hundred) € + 21,00 € (twenty-one/00) at the time of enrolment.

The participation fee and the enrolment fee can be paid through the Apply@polito platform.

² The insurance premium may change due to new rules adopted by Edisu and to the stipulation of an insurance contract.



Your advance fee (1.000,00 €) can be reimbursed only in the following cases:

- if the Italian Embassy does not issue your Visa (for non-EU citizens only);
- if the programme does not start, which happens only if the minimum number of participants is not reached.

Enrolling in the programme, you accept any obligation and charge related to the payment of the participation and enrolment fee.

If you withdraw from the programme or are excluded from it, you will not be reimbursed your participation fee and enrolment fee under any circumstances.

The issue of the Diploma of the 2nd level Specializing Master's programme in Space Exploration and Development Systems requires the payment of a revenue stamp.

Participation sponsored by Third Parties

If your participation in the programme is sponsored by Third Parties (payment of one or more instalments), it will be processed as follows:

- the sponsor must complete and submit the form available at https://didattica.polito.it/master/home/it/finanziamento_quote_per_il_dipendente
- at the end of the admission process, the sponsor will receive a message with:
 - the list of admitted sponsored candidates
 - payment methods
- The 2nd level Specializing Master's Programme in "Space Exploration and Development Systems" is included in the course catalogue of Politecnico. Therefore, participation and enrolment fees are VAT exempt (Article 4 of DPR 633/72). Upon payment, Politecnico di Torino will issue a payment receipt.

The rules set out in the "Regole Operative per la gestione dei Master universitari e dei corsi di Formazione Permanente" ("Operational Rules for the Management of University Master's Programmes and Lifelong Learning Courses") apply to all students enrolled in the Master's programme, including those whose tuition fees are paid by an external company or institution.

With regard to non-payment or late payment of fees and the blocking of a student's academic record:

- if the participation fee or any other amounts due are not paid in full by the relevant deadline, the student's academic record will be blocked and no administrative procedures (such as exam registration, withdrawal from programme, the issuance of certificates or self-declarations, etc.) may be carried out. The academic record will be reinstated only after the due amount has been paid.



- in the event of forfeiture of student status (due to failure to meet requirements), any unpaid amounts remain due and must be paid.

The programme starts only if the minimum number of participants is reached.

ART. 9 (Scholarships)

Politecnico di Torino offers to SEEDS Programme participants the opportunity to benefit from 4 scholarships.

In order to be eligible for scholarships, applicants must be admitted to the 2nd level Specializing Master's Programme in "Space Exploration and Development Systems" a.y. 2026/2027.

Candidates need only to submit application to the Specializing Master's Programme by the deadline. There's no separate scholarship application process or extra supporting documentation required for funding. Based on the information supplied in their application, candidates will be automatically considered for scholarships.

Scholarships shall be awarded by the Selection Committee to the four highest-ranked students, according to the admission ranking list.

Please note that scholarships are available exclusively for students attending lectures in-person. Students attending lectures online cannot be awarded any scholarship. In case one or more of the 4 top students decides to attend lectures online the scholarship will be re-assigned to the next student on the ranking list attending lectures in-person.

Scholarship recipients are required to attend at least 90% of the programme (including lectures and training activities). Failure to meet the attendance requirement may result in suspension or withdrawal of the scholarship.

At the end of the selection process, the list of the scholarship recipients will be published on the Politecnico website on the "Selection outcomes" page.

Scholarship recipients will have to confirm their acceptance through a declaration form which will be published on the website. This form must be filled in and sent by email (master.universitari@polito.it) within a given deadline (generally within 7-10 days).

If one or more candidates do not confirm the acceptance within the deadline, the scholarship will be re-assigned to students on the reserve list according to their position in the list.

The candidates placed on the reserve list will be contacted only if a scholarship winner does not confirm. In this case, a new deadline will be assigned.



The gross amount of the scholarship, including IRAP tax, is 5.000,00 Euro (five thousand/00).

Payment of the scholarship is made in 11 instalments of equal amount. The first instalment is not paid at the moment of arrival at Politecnico, but at the end of the month following the enrolment.

Payment of the scholarship and the participation to the 2nd level Specializing Master's Programme will be interrupted in case of irregular attendance of classes or insufficient grades, according to the Programme's Regulation.

The scholarship may be subject to IRPEF taxation as it shall be considered as equivalent to an employee income. In order to establish the correct tax category, the student will therefore be required to fill in the "Tax Information" on the personal page of Politecnico web portal.

Politecnico di Torino reserves the right to offer other scholarships or excellence awards addressed to the SEEDS programme participants in case of further availability of funding.

ART. 10 **(Excellence awards)**

Three awards are available as extra financial help.

These awards are intended to support three students who will participate in the 78th edition of the International Astronautical Congress – IAC, to be held in Poznań, Poland, from 27th September to 1st October 2027.

The gross amount of each award corresponds to € 1.200,00, including IRAP tax, and is intended to contribute towards the costs of the following:

- travel expenses;
- hotel;
- meals;
- conference registration.

In order to be considered for these awards, students must:

- be enrolled in the 2nd Level Specializing Master's programme in "Space Exploration and Development Systems" a.y. 2026/2027
- have passed all the exams included in their Study Plan with a weighted average grade equal or higher than 25/30
- have attended lectures in-person



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The awards will be assigned to the three top students with the highest weighted average of all the graded exams included in their Specializing Master Study Plan. In case of equal weighted average, the award will be assigned to the student who scored higher on the admission ranking list.³

Please note that Excellence awards are available exclusively for students who attended lectures in-person.

The award is compatible with other sources of financial support. However, if any student has already been awarded a scholarship by another institution for participating in the same congress, they will no longer be considered eligible.
